Melbourne is a cosmopolitan city, widely considered a culture and arts hub, and a must-see destination for foodies. There is always something to see or do, with a wide range of Australian and international shows and exhibits year-round.

Melbourne is serviced by two airports, Melbourne Airport and Avalon Airport. While you are more likely to arrive at Melbourne Airport, many carriers offer flights to Avalon and it's important to double-check your booking as it can catch some travellers out.

Hughes offers transfers from both airports.

Climate

Melbourne has a temperate oceanic climate, and weather conditions can be variable even on the same day, leading Australians to say that Melbourne experiences ' four seasons in one day'. So it's best to pack for changing conditions, even on short getaways. Winters tend to be crisper and cooler than its northern neighbours, but summers can still be dry and hot.

Melbourne offers a variety of cultural and food experiences, from international gallery exhibitions and touring shows to fresh produce markets and fine dining. It is also a sporting hub, with the world-famous MCG hosting domestic and international cricket in the summer and local favourite AFL Football in the autumn and winter. In addition, it's the home of the Australian Open tennis tournament, held at Rod Laver Arena in January each year.

It's about more than just the CBD too. Just outside the city, you'll find diverse neighbourhoods that are well worth a visit, including St Kilda, Collingwood, Footscray, Fitzroy, South Yarra and Carlton.



Take a tram trip through the city

No visit to Melbourne is complete without a tram ride. The historic tram network will take you all over the city. It can be great for getting from A to B in the city centre and is an experience in its own right.



Take a street art tour

Melbourne is known for quirky and striking street art, and you'll find it all over the place, hidden in the myriad of laneways that crisscross the city. Hosier Lane, AC/DC Lane and Meyers Place are among those worth a visit. Your Hughes driver can take you on a personalised tour so you can see all the hotspots in comfort.



Visit St Kilda

An idyllic beach location close to the city, St Kilda always has something to see or do. A walk along the esplanade to the pier and lunch at Hotel Esplanade is a popular way to spend a sunny morning. For those seeking more of an adrenalin rush, nearby Luna Park has you covered with 20 rides and amusements.



Get arty at the National Gallery of Victoria (NGV)

A Melbourne icon, the NGV boasts one of the most impressive collections of Asian, Oceanic and American art and hosts many international exhibitions throughout the year. It's Australia's





oldest public museum and boasts some fantastic architecture too. Entry is free, but some exhibitions may require a separate paid ticket.



Visit the inner city suburbs

The inner city suburbs of Melbourne offer diverse scenes, from culture and food to arts and architecture. Check out Brunswick for some great eats, South Yarra for shopping, Abbotsford for art, Collingwood or Carlton for incredible cafes and Fitzroy for a vibrant, bohemian vibe.



Get some retail therapy

Melbourne is a hotspot for local and international designer and artisan shopping. Key places to check out include Bourke Street Mall, Queen Victoria Markets and Chapel Street. For high-end shopping, you can't go past Toorak Road, with its numerous luxury stores.



Reflect with a view at the Shrine of Remembrance


